BATTERY TYPES

TRP offers three main types of heavy-duty truck batteries compatible with a wide range of commercial vehicles:

TRP Starting Batteries are a go-to for basic power needs. These flooded lead-acid batteries deliver high cold cranking amps (CCA) for reliable engine starts all year round. This type is most suitable for day cabs and local or regional hauls.

TRP Dual Purpose Batteries offer solid starting power and deep-cycle strength. These are great for sleepers, trucks with APUs, or trucks running additional electronics and liftgates that need to handle power and endurance equally well.

Absorbed Glass Mat (AGM) Batteries are a premium pick. They're sealed, maintenance-free, and spill-proof. Their vibration resistance and deep-cycle performance make them perfect for rough road conditions.

HOW TO CHOOSE A BATTERY

Very few people use the right battery for the job. The first rule is to choose the type of **Group 31 battery** based on the work you do. Keep these tips in mind:

- Check your truck's owner's manual to verify the group size of your vehicle's battery
- Look at CCA and reserve capacity (higher is better for cold and heavy-load conditions)
- Balance your budget with how long you expect it to last

WHEN TO REPLACE YOUR TRUCK BATTERY

Most commercial truck batteries typically last 3 to 5 years, but that depends on usage, weather, maintenance, and idle time. Watch for these signs that your battery is wearing out:

- Dim lights or slow engine turnover
- Clicking noises when turning the key
- Battery warning light on the dash
- Corrosion around battery terminals
- Needing frequent jump starts

BATTERY PRICES
